(and probably correctly I think) "a foraminiferous shell (*Peneroplis planatus*, Montfort)." Whether it be this or not it is certain that it has nothing to do with the present species of *Carinaria*.

In 1880 Péron and Lesueur figured this species in the Annales du Museum, and imposed upon it the name of "Carinaire Lamarck," which seven years later was rendered into Latin (Carinaria lamarkii) by de Blainville.

This name, which has been overlooked by all subsequent writers, has some years' priority over that of *Carinaria mediterranea*, and should therefore be employed. It is remarkable that Deshayes should not have been acquainted with this fact, and that de Blainville subsequently designated this species with the name *Carinaria mediterranea*.

In the Dictionaire classique d'histoire naturelle Bory de Saint Vincent pointed out that the shell figured in the Encyclopédie Méthodique as Carinaria fragilis is different from that species, and imposed upon it the name of Carinaria lamarckii. This is now always regarded the same as the well-known Mediterranean species, and it is a curious coincidence that Bory de Saint Vincent should have given to it the same name as that proposed by Péron and Lesueur.
